Fifth Sunday of Easter

Dear Parishioners,

We celebrated Confirmation this past week. We were so happy to have 33 young people who were confirmed. We are grateful to Kelly Groesbeck, our Youth Minister, for providing the excellent formation of our Confirmation students so they might be well disposed to receive the grace of this sacrament. The support from sponsors, families, friends and parishioners was heartwarming and evident in the numbers that attended; thank you to all.

Bishop Mueggenborg did the Confirmation and gave an excellent homily about the Sacrament of Confirmation and the gifts of the Holy Spirit. He reminded us that it is docility to the Holy Spirit that moves us along the path of doing God's will and transforms us to being that instrument, vessel and vehicle of God's love and presence in the world. He said it is only God, our creator, who can give us our dignity, true identity and purpose as human beings. It is the Holy Spirit's action in us that enables us to fully realize our potential as persons. Confirmation completes our full initiation into the church which is vital for godparents and marriage. We can see this full potential at work in the lives of the Saints. They are the model for us of docility to the Holy Spirit.

One person in particular in whom we can see this full realization of personhood was Mary. Mary was completely open and docile to the action of the Holy Spirit, first within her heart, and then her body received the body of Christ. Mary had such a close and intimate relationship with the Holy Spirit that St. Maximilian Kolbe said Mary was the "spouse of the Holy Spirit". The actions of the Holy Spirit in Mary and in the Apostles after Pentecost are examples of what is possible with the Holy Spirit. The action of the Holy Spirit realizes potentials hitherto unimagined. The action of the Holy Spirit is necessary in making us to be the best versions of ourselves. Mary can teach us docility to the Holy Spirit.

During the month of May we celebrate Mother's Day, and we think of think of Mary as our spiritual mother. May crownings, Mary altars and praying the Rosary have long been part of May for Catholics. I am happy that this year the school is setting up a Mary's altar so the children can bring flowers to honor Mary during May. The month of May is an excellent time to honor our mother Mary by praying the Rosary, learning more about the Rosary and going deeper into the mystery of the Rosary. I can't imagine how happy Mary must be when we honor her with a bouquet of flowers we call the Rosary. Incidentally the word "Rosary" comes from bouquet of roses.

“That All May Sing” - A WEEKLY MUSIC CLASS FOR CHILDREN AGES 7-13. Plans are being made to offer a musical “short course” for children starting in May and running until mid-June, picking up again in September after the Summer vacations. The class will offer a complete music education in Gregorian Chant, its notation, theory, and practice as well modern notation and theory. Particular emphasis will be placed on the cultivation of a beautiful vocal tone, on sight singing and reading through the learning of solfege (do, re, mi, fa, etc.), as well as musical dictation, rhythm, and rudimentary directing.

The child in this course will learn to discover their first and most important musical instrument- their own voice. The learning of music at an early age has been proven to vastly improve a child’s IQ and test scores and success in life in general.

The class will be offered by Jeffrey Morse, a student of Dr. Mary Berry at Cambridge (UK) in Gregorian Chant and Semiology as well as Ward Method, and holds a certificate in Ward Method studies (a method of teaching music to children) from the University of Northern Colorado where he was a student of Dr Alise Brown. Students successfully completing this course will be invited to be the first singers in a child chorister program that will be developed next year if they so desire.





SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

INFANT BAPTISM - Parents and godparents attend one session to prepare to celebrate this sacrament. We encourage parents to attend before the birth or adoption of their child. Please call the Parish Office at least **six weeks prior to the desired Baptism date** to register your child. **Next preparation class** is on **July 22nd, 2018 beginning with mass at 11AM and ending by 2:30PM**. Please call the Parish Office to register. Upcoming baptisms are on **June 10th, July 8th, and August 12, 2018**. Baptisms are scheduled with Father Vincent on the ***second Sunday of the month, after the 11AM Mass***. Parishioners who prefer to have the Baptism at “their” regular mass time may make that request through the parish office.

MARRIAGE - Couples wishing to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the parish **at least 6 months** prior to the desired date. Preparation for celebrating and living the sacrament is required. Catholics are to be confirmed prior to celebrating marriage. Contact Roberta Tassani for more information.

ANOIDTING OF THE SICK - is celebrated any time there is a serious illness or health crisis. Contact the parish office to make arrangements.

FUNERALS - Please contact the parish after a death, and before making arrangements with a funeral home.

CONFIRMATION - The Sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated yearly for those who are age 16 or older. Attendance at preparation sessions is required. Contact the Parish office or email kellyg@holyrosaryedmonds.org for information. Adults who have not been confirmed may also celebrate the sacrament, which is a requirement for the Sacrament of Marriage and a prerequisite to be a godparent. Contact Roberta Tassani for information.

FIRST RECONCILIATION/FIRST EUCHARIST - Children are prepared for these sacraments after completing a year of remote preparation in either the school or a religious education program. This is a two-year program; the first year is a general introduction, and the second year being specific preparation. Parents attend preparation sessions for each sacrament. Contact Mary Hupf, Director for Elementary Faith Formation, for more information.

BECOMING CATHOLIC - Adults who wish to join the Catholic Faith participate in sessions of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) Contact the Parish Office for further information.
